A special shout out to Peyton, Madison, Hope, and Emma, older students who guided the younger students through this program and did a great job!


Free Movie Nights

We are thankful to be able to offer these and other family friendly events to our students of Wayne County. A special thanks to Bob Ohmann, Ceasar.


